Tier Clarification Guidance

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GUIDANCE – TIER CLARIFICATION

The entry requirements for each tier of the LSI Credentialing Register are set out below

Example:

Service engineer who maintains or repairs equipment in non-patient areas – Tier 1 would be appropriate. If the equipment had to be repaired in an area where patients are present then Tier 2 would be required.

Representative who provides support to surgeons in an operating theatre setting – Tier 3 would be required.

Sales representatives with Tier 1 registration, who is asked by a healthcare professional to meet with them on a ward – the representative will have to explain that they cannot enter areas where patients are present.
